From the classroom to the control room, Cumi Manibusan has carved a path of growth, determination, and hands-on success—with the support of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) guiding him along the way.

"Right after high school, I felt like I wanted to try going to school at NMC," Cumi shared. "At the time, it was Ms. Rose who was my counselor. She helped me fly to Saipan, find an apartment, and even provided a stipend so I could go to school. That was very helpful."

With time, Cumi realized that he was drawn to a more handson career path. OVR supported his decision to explore trades work, and he began training as a stocker at Tian Hong Market (formerly Long Feng). From there, he trained under his uncle at Telesource—a move that would eventually lead him to a permanent role at the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC).

Today, Cumi works as an Assistant Operator in CUC's Power Generation Division. His responsibilities include monitoring power engines to ensure they run efficiently and answering calls during outages to keep the community informed and supported.

"After a couple of years, everything has been going great," he said. "But I want to broaden my experience, so I'll be moving next month to Texas to gain more experience in the states."

Cumi's journey reflects not just career growth, but personal development as well. His mother shared her appreciation for the support OVR provided during those early transitions:

"I remember before, he would be very shy and wouldn't really talk to anyone. Now, he's more open and doesn't really feel nervous to talk to people. OVR was very helpful and I really appreciate you guys helping my son," she said.

When asked if he had any words of inspiration for others, Cumi offered thoughtful advice:

"Always jump at any opportunity not just with work, but also with life. No matter how many times you fail, just keep going. Keep on succeeding in your own ways."

We're seeking new volunteer members to fill the following seats:


- Community rehabilitation program (1)
